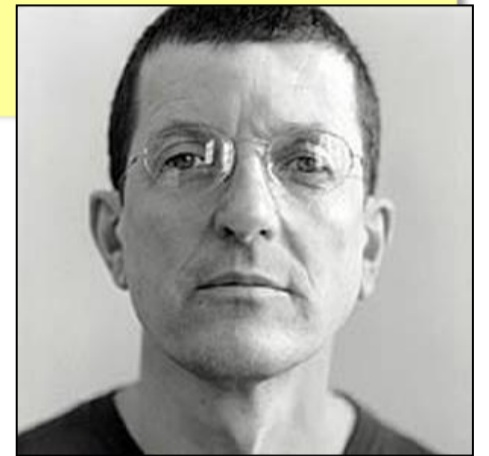

Sculpture

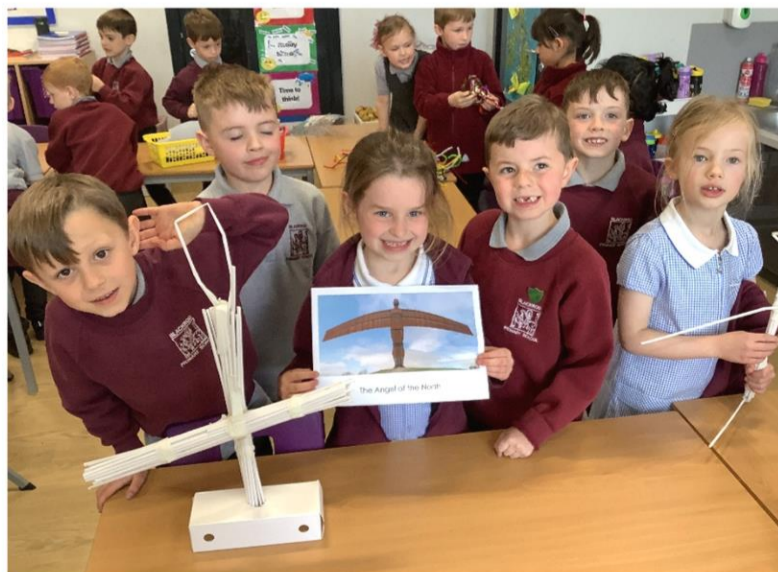
The children learnt all about Sculptures and that they are 3-D models. Things that are 3-D are not flat like paintings and drawings.

We looked closely at the work of an artist who is a sculptor called Antony Gormley.

Antony Gormley is a famous sculptor, who is still alive today. He was born in London in 1950. He is probably most famous for creating 'The Angel of the North', a sculpture that stands by the side of a busy road called the A1 in Gateshead.



We really enjoyed moulding exploring with the clay to make different shapes and textures



The children used a range of media to recreate some of Antony Gormley's sculptures. We were very impressed with the Angel of the North and Field creations.

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The children learnt about the different tools that artists use to model clay and had the chance to use some of the tools to make patterns in the clay.
