RE: Hinduism - Why do Hindus try to be good?

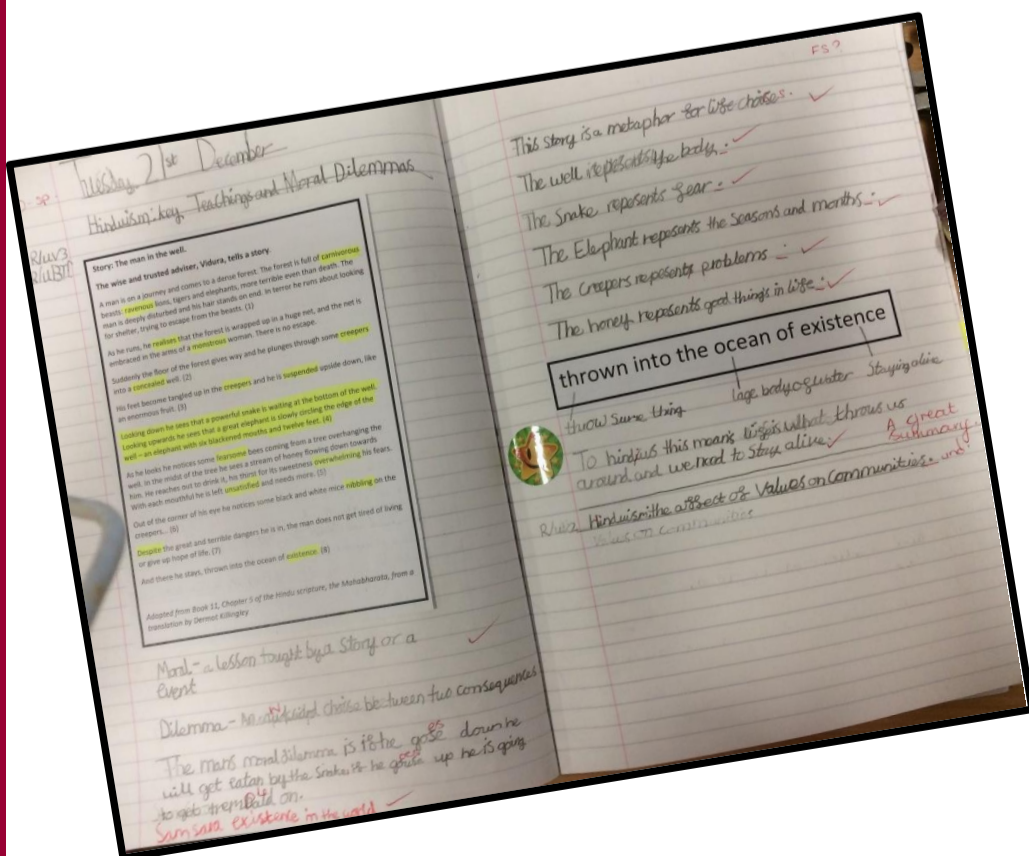
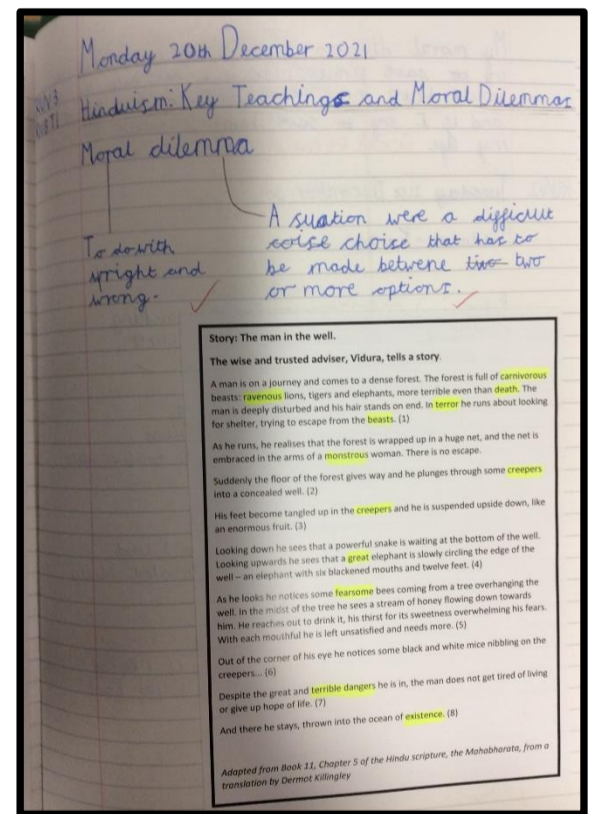

We explored the meaning of these words such as moral, dilemma and used our ideas to help us understand a story from the Hindu Mahabharata.

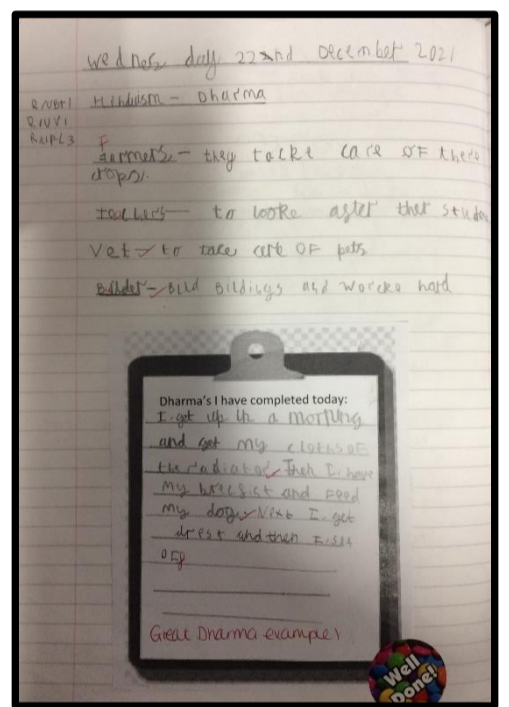
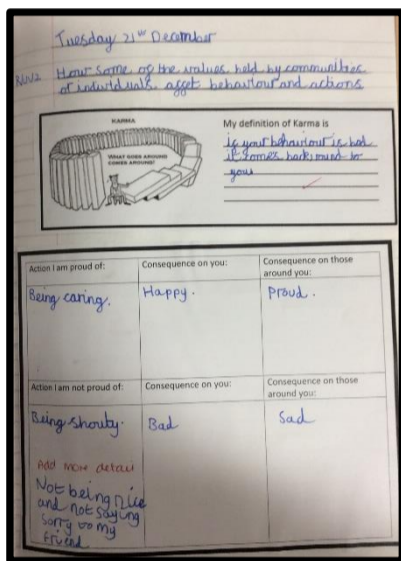
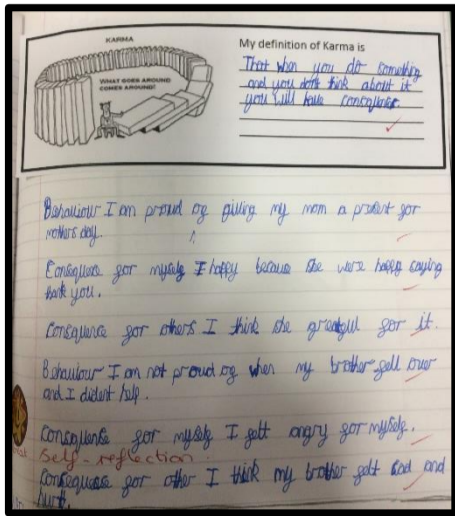


'The man in the well', a popular story from Hinduism, helped us to better understand the term 'moral dilemma'.

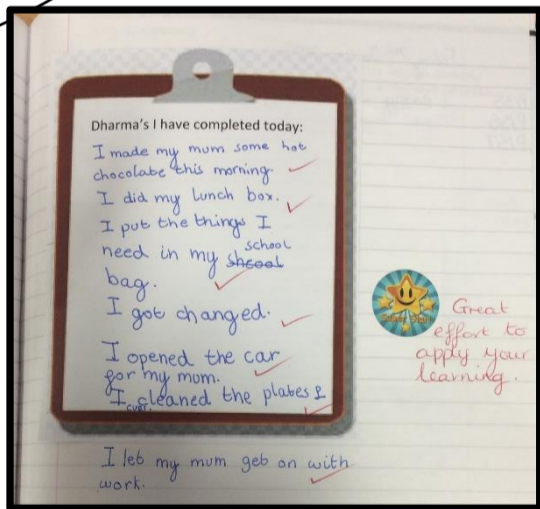
