through it.



How to make a pencil case

First measure and cut out the shape and size

bigger. After that fold over the back one
and do overcast until you get to the front.
Next dot it on the other side and the bottom.
Soon after make a couple holes. Finally, put
ribbon through the holes and tie it up.
