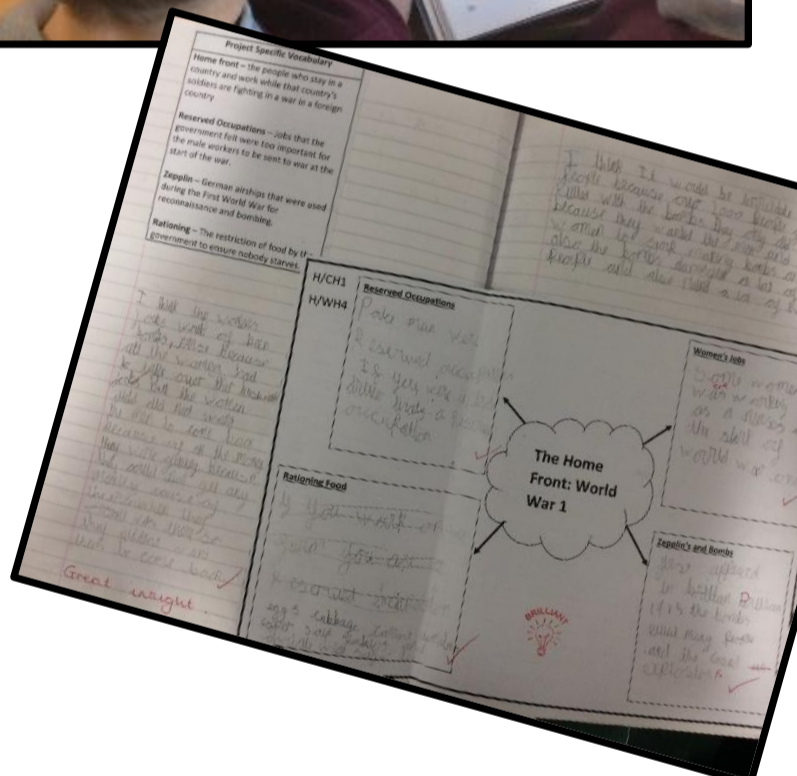
Autumn Project Reflections

We then used this new knowledge to develop links to our previous local history learning and described the changes that we thought may have happened in Blackrod during this era of history.

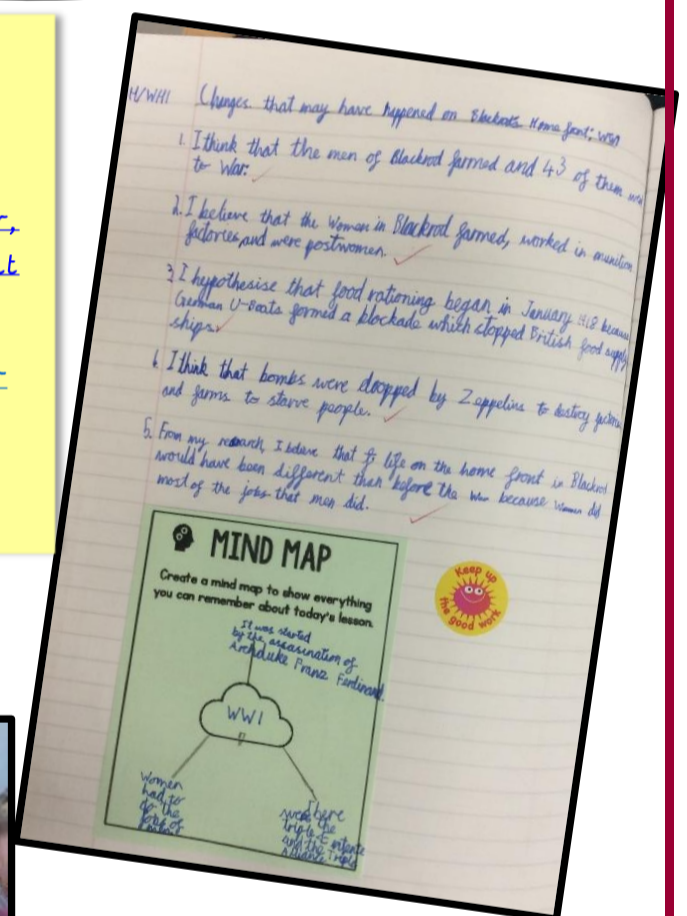

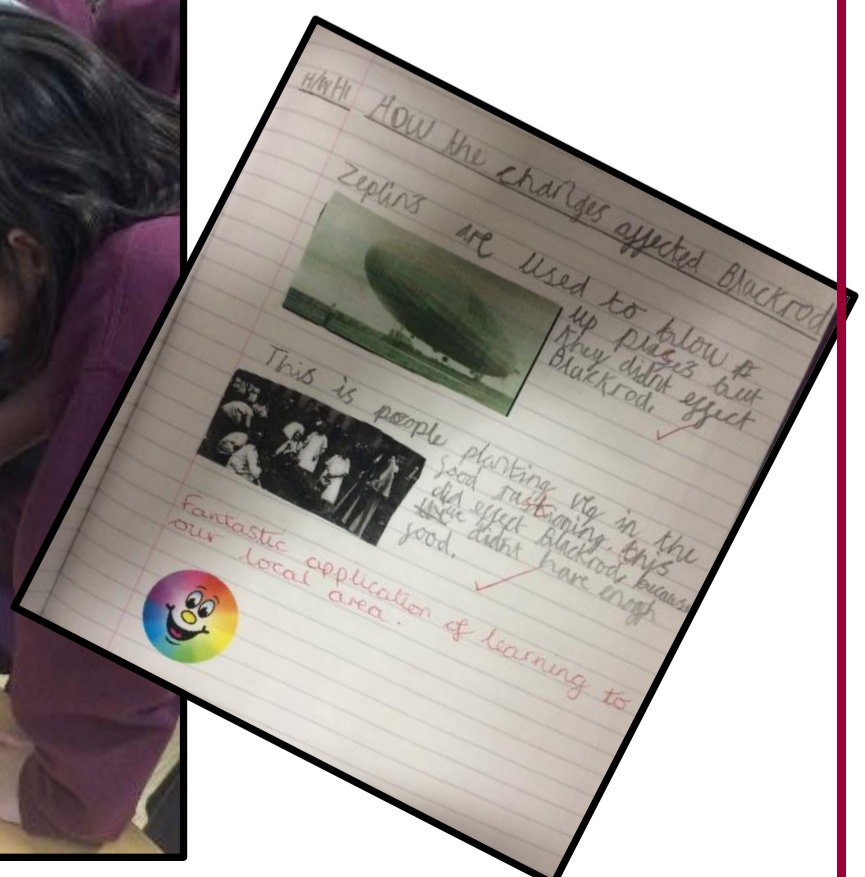

Key vocabulary

- Home front - the people who work at home while that country's soldiers are abroad fighting in a war.
- Reserved Occupations - Jobs that the government, at the start of the war, felt were too important for the male workers to be sent to war.
- Rationing - The limiting of food by the government to make sure nobody starved.
- Zeppelin - The Germans used these during the First World War to spy on Britain and drop bombs.

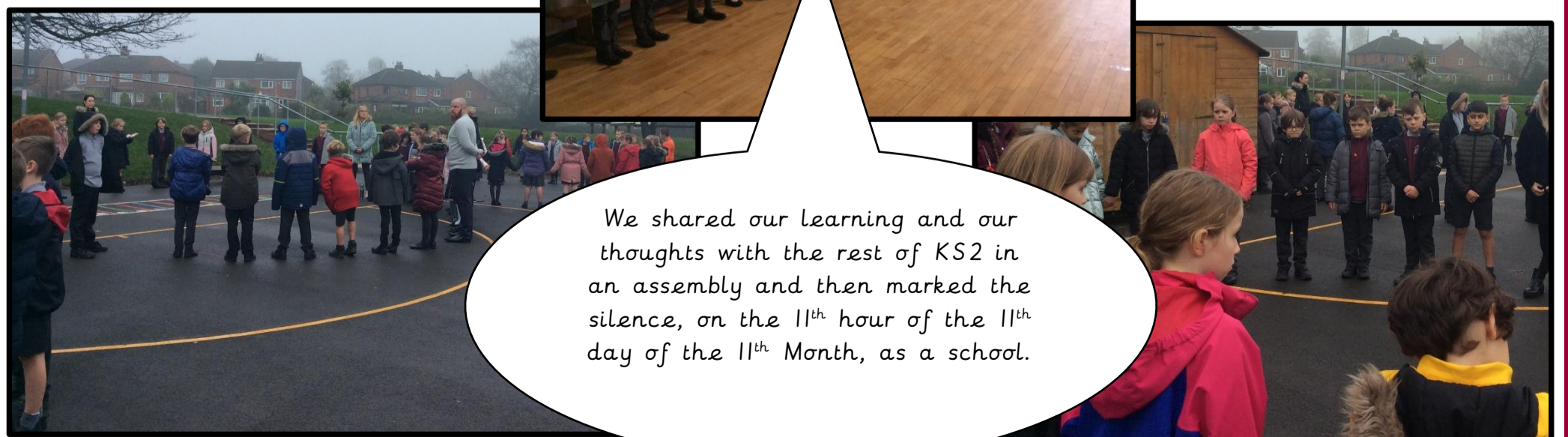
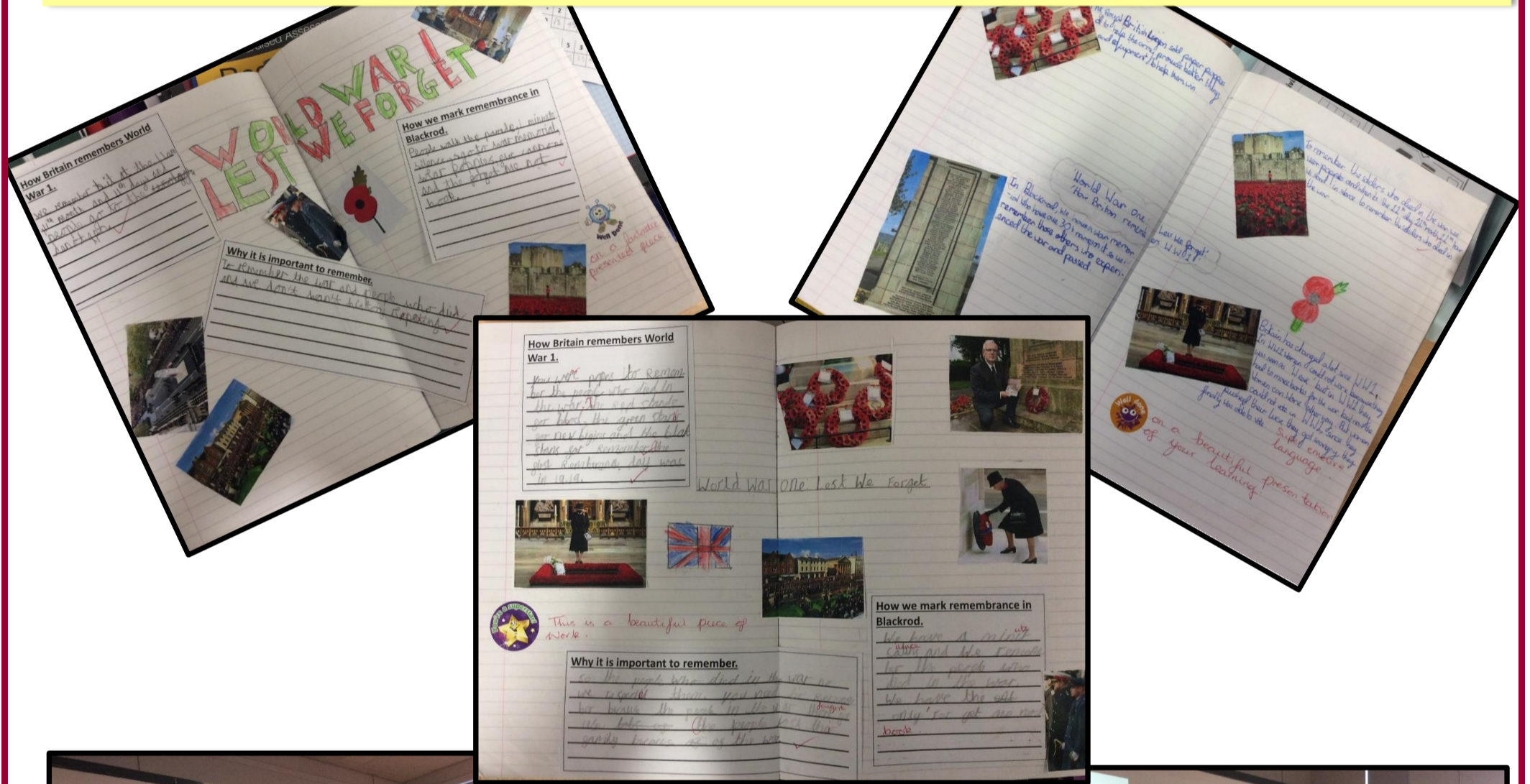
