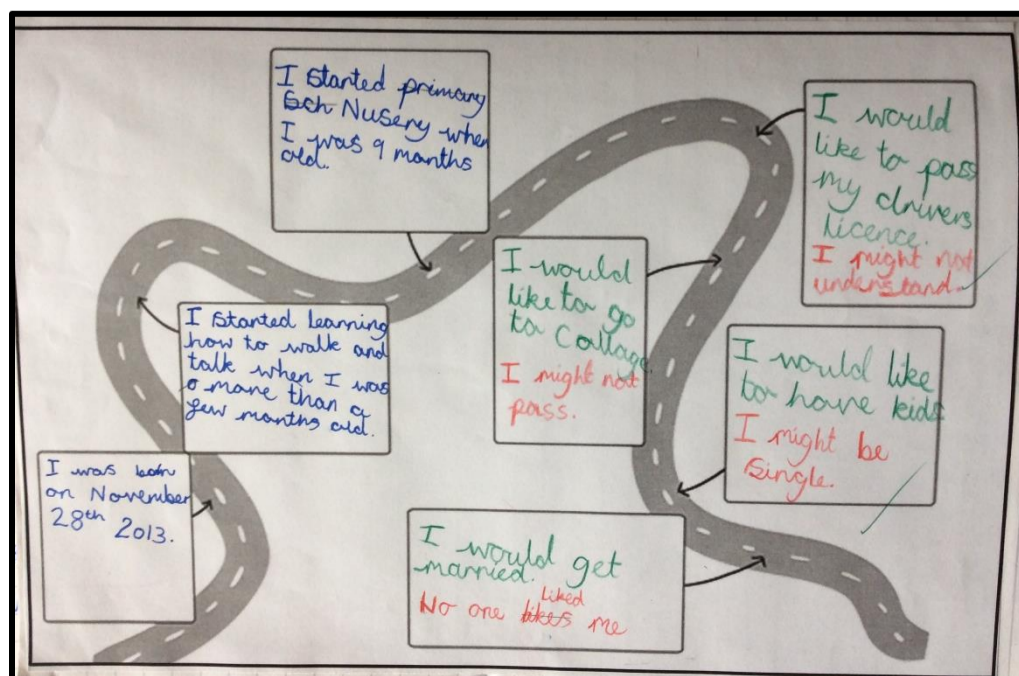
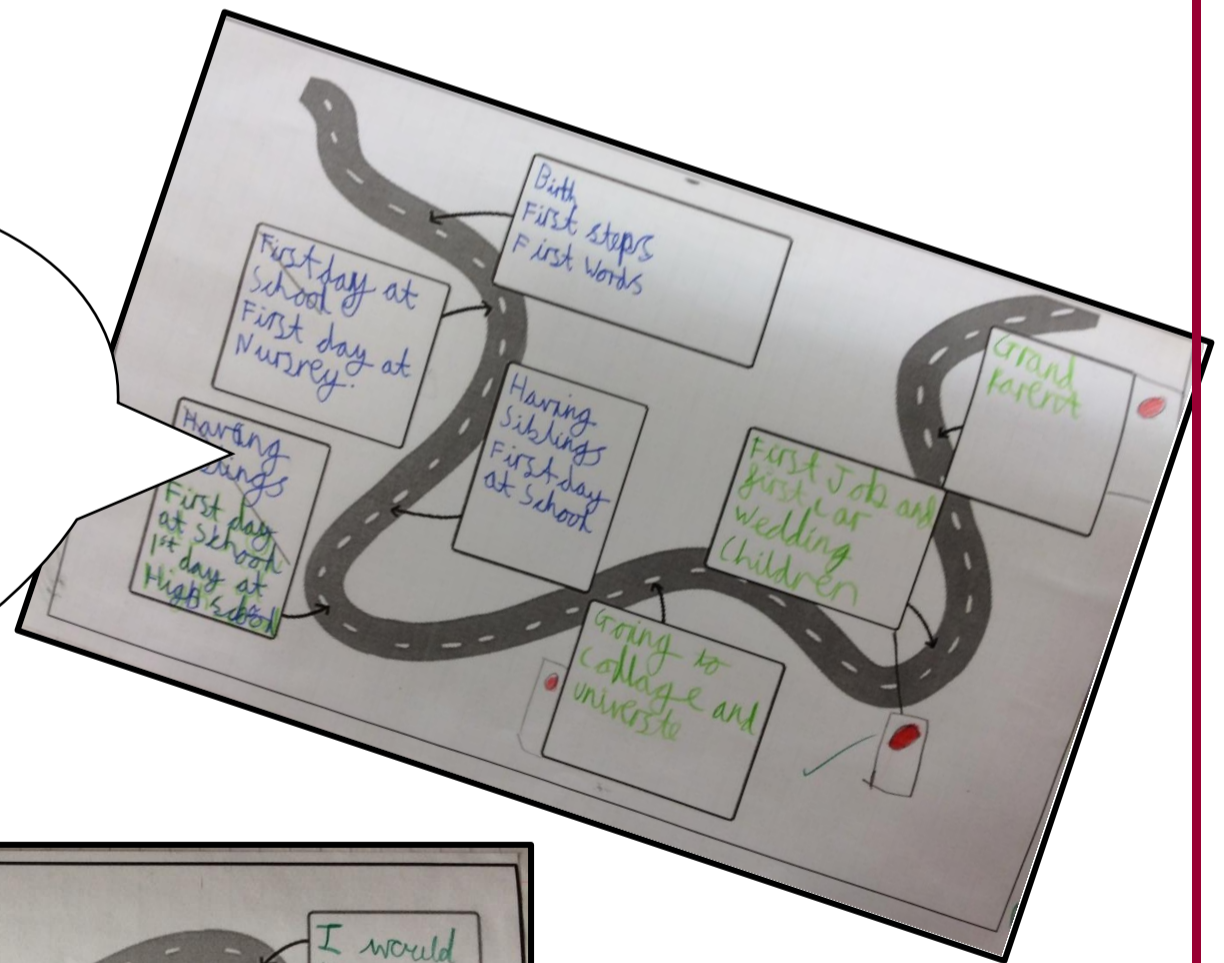

the bride wears a red and white dress for Hinduism and Islam.

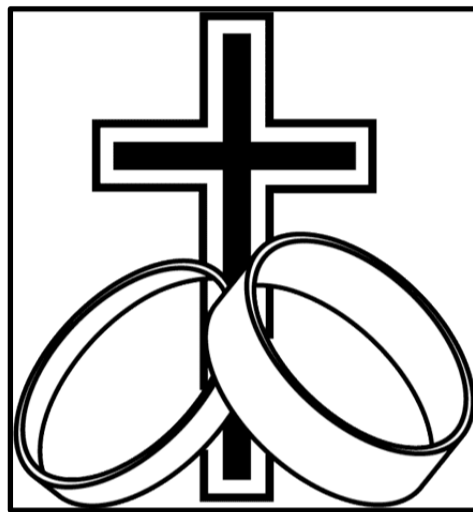
Hindus invite their whole community and Islam don't.

a) They promise to Allah that they will not lie so they will live a life of no lies or sins.

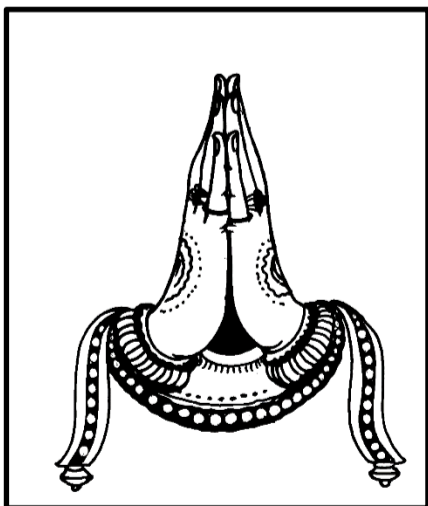
