### Jubilee Bunting/applique techniques

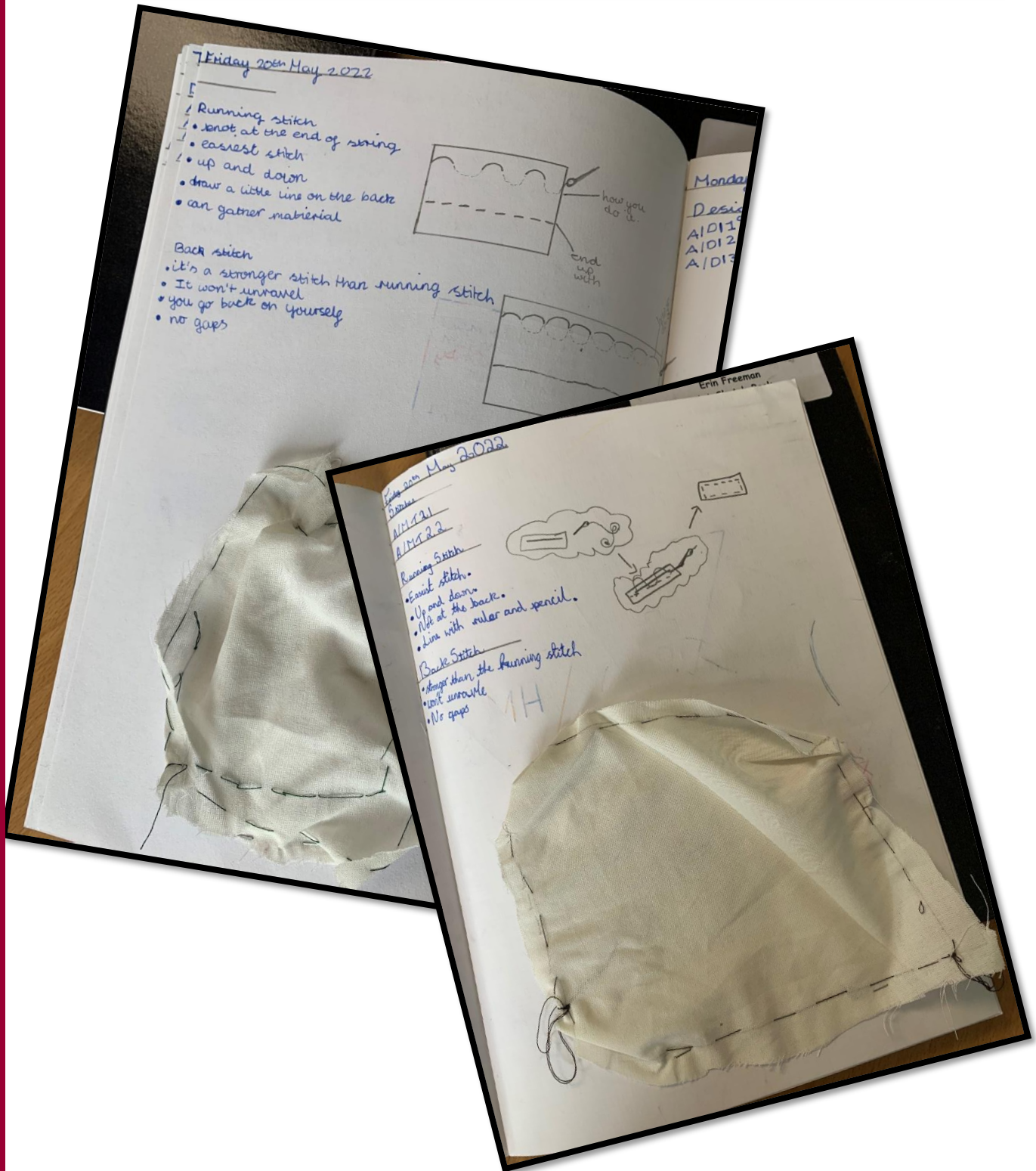

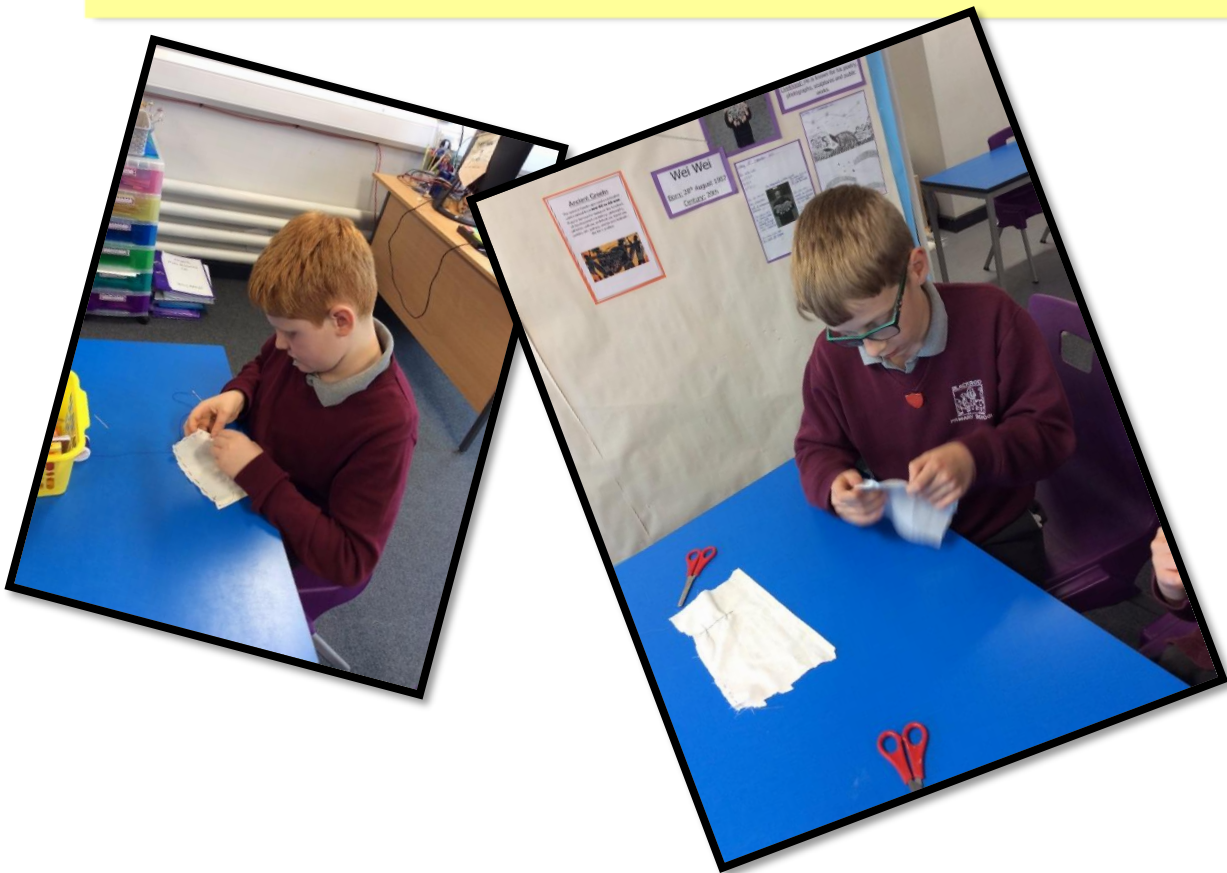
